Module 2/6 33 hours	Paint the Town Red: 2D	This module focuses on the exploration of painting for a community event or public space. Module 3/7 32 hours	Surprising Sculptures : 3D	This module focuses on community engagement and interaction with sculpture, wearable art and wearable sculpture. Students will create either an assemblage sculpture or a themed wearable artwork made from recycled materials to display at a local community arts event.	Project Plan, create and evaluate a sculpture or series of sculptures, using recycled materials, accompanied by an artist statement, for an exhibition held within the school community. Module 4/8 23 hours	Selling Out: Craft	In this module, students will research jewellery and other popular crafts currently being sold and promoted through websites and arts centres. From this research and teacher instruction, they will develop a range of craft skills in order to create useful or decorative objects that could be sold on community art websites or stalls.	Product Develop unique craft objects and present them in a manner to be marketed. Module 5/1 28 Hours	Printing Up a Storm: 2D	This module will focus on the area of printmaking. Students will develop a variety of printmaking techniques including stencil art and screen printing. Module 6/2 30 hours	Breaking the Mould: 3D	This module will explore the world of sculpture. Students will develop modelling skills in ceramics and assemblage. They will use and apply the elements and principles of design to create an outdoor garden sculpture for display in the school grounds. Module 7/3 25 hours	Artist Book: 2D	This module will allow students to investigate the world of 'Artists' Books' by exploring a variety of books, including those housed at the State library of Queensland. They will learn many techniques and use a range of materials to create artist books such as concertina, Coptic binding and various one-sheet folds.	Project Create a range of artists' books. Module 8/4 30 hours	To Market We Will Go: Craft	In this module, students will research the history of greeting cards and paper crafts currently in the marketplace. They are to develop a range of cards or paper crafts that reflect the essence of the school and the local community, taking inspiration from significant events, landmarks and people in the community region. From this research and teacher instruction, students will use a range of mediums and art materials to develop a range of cards or paper crafts. This project will enable students to investigate the process of becoming a stall holder and expose them to a range of art careers. The final product must be suitable to sell at a community market stall or an arts event.
