2023 has seen the completion of brand new and renovated facilities here at Bracken Ridge.

This included:

- The new learning centre, K block, now provides purpose-built drama and dance, multi-media, music and standard classrooms, under cover area, staffroom and toilets.
- D block received 3 newly renovated classrooms and furniture for STEM.
- Multi-purpose courts with lighting providing two full basketball courts and provision for tennis, volleyball, netball and European handball.
- Upgraded carpark with dedicated visitor turn-around and parking along with 44 additional carpark spaces.

#### SENIOR SCHOOL UPDATE

As quickly as we say goodbye to a cohort, we welcome a new group of senior students. Our graduating cohort for 2023 are reminded of the Link and Launch supports available to them to secure employment, further study or training options.

In 2024, we are looking forward to welcoming the current Year 10 cohort into Year 11.

In the senior phase of education, students engage in subjects and VET qualifications they have chosen to support their post-schooling pathways. In Term 4, a number of Year 10 students have been proactive and met with our Industry Liaison Officer — Diane Heinze — to arrange TAFE at School enrolments and several Year 10 students have already secured traineeships that start in 2024. If you are interested in one of these options, please visit the Senior Schooling Hub, located at the rear of Student Services in the first week of Term 1, 2024 to discuss options.

Senior students that choose to remain at Bracken Ridge to complete their senior phase of learning must comply with the Senior School Enrolment Agreement signed at SET Planning earlier in the year. Expectations include maintaining approved attendance levels of 95% and above to support academic outcomes, and attempting and submitting all assessment as per the BRSHS Assessment Policy. Maintaining attendance and engagement in the learning program are connected to positive academic outcomes, and in Senior Schooling the curriculum content, assessment, and due dates are governed by the Queensland Curriculum & Assessment Authority (QCAA), and there is significantly less flexibility than the junior and middle years curriculum.

At times, the academic rigor and expectations of learning in the Senior School can prove to be a challenge for students transitioning from Year 10 to Year 11. Families are encouraged to use the holidays to audit the study habits and environment of their senior student and to put into action habits and resources that will support their child's academic and personal wellbeing in 2024. The Senior Schooling team are another avenue of support, together with the Wellbeing team, and you can contact us at any time to discuss concerns about your child's transition.

We look forward to another successful year in learning, and we wish all our families and students a safe holiday period.


